Cultural Anthropology or Multicultural Studies	ANT 101	Cultural Anthropology OR a course in multicultural studies
Creative Arts	Examples: ART 101 MUS 120	One non-performance course in dance, fine arts, film, literature, music, theatre, or other creative arts. OR a third or fourth level language course with proof of a literature component.
History, Foreign Language, Microeconomics, Philosophy, or Political Science	Examples of course combinations: HIS 122 and PHI 112	Two courses are required. Each course must be from a different subject area.
