Target Audience

Advanced practice nurses, physician assistants, pharmacists, physicians, mental health counselors and other interested providers.

Course Description

This conference will provide evidence-based tools and skills that can be implemented into primary care practices and other clinical settings where patients may exhibit mental health concerns.

Learner Outcomes

Upon completion of this conference, participants will:

- Provide evidence of increased knowledge by stating at least one intended professional development change or practice change related to mental health in primary care.
- List at least 1 new "practical pearl" to implement when assessing the mental health of patients in primary care or other healthcare settings.

Learner Objectives

Upon completion of this conference, participants should be able to:

- Describe key findings on mental health trends in adolescents in the US; extrapolate current concerns for adolescent mental health; and suggest potential preventive healthcare measures moving forward.
- 2. List risks versus benefits in common MH medications and considerations for changes.
- Discuss pros and cons of "psychedelic" medications in MH therapy and describe potential physical/emotional responses.
- 4. Describe the importance of age considerations when caring for older adults and list treatment considerations for this population.

- 5. Express an understanding of common cognitive changes in older adults and suggest best practices for providing support.
- 6. Identify strategies for diagnosing common MH diagnoses seen in primary care and suggest treatment approaches.
- List reasons why individuals who experience gender dysphoria are at higher risk for developing mental illness and will suggest interventions to promote health and well-being.
- 8. Describe the importance of a sense of belonging and why it is fundamental to managing stress and coping effectively.
- 9. Express an understanding of the importance of fostering collaborative research and education to promote innovative approaches and transform mental health world-wide.
