

What is the difference between my Faculty Adviser and my Clinical Mentor?

Faculty Adviser: A doctorally prepared individual on faculty at the College of Nursing. This person will be responsible for guiding your methods, your questions, shaping your scholarly paper.

Clinical Mentor: An individual at your clinical agency who assists you on the clinical side. This person will be responsible for guiding your process on the clinical side. This person may have some "clout" to assist with teamwork, leadership, data processes, and change in the organization.

Should these individuals communicate? If possible. They will often touch base during the proposal presentation process or if there are issues with the implementation of the project. Their communication is not a requirement.
