




Participants' location when they joined the study:



Preliminary results of weekly surveys thorough November 2024

Goals reported by participants.



The most commonly reported goals are related to education, employment, financial and living situation.



48% are not using their preferred **birth control**

Reasons for not using it: Cost, difficulty getting an appointment, not having sex frequently, concerns about side effects, insertion, or removal, not having enough information, and provider discouragement.

Well-being




20% reported changes in *physical health*.




35% reported changes in *mental health*.
